Attention Future Attendee:

- ❖ Students must arrive between 8:15– 8:45pm to register (at the Waterloo Region Courthouse, [85 Frederick Street, Kitchener, ON](#)).
- ❖ When you receive your nametag, please wear it for the remainder of the event.
- ❖ It is very important you stay with your assigned group all day.
- ❖ If other students from your school are attending *Braiding Diversity into Justice*, we will do our best to place you in the same group. If this isn't possible, please remember that this is a great opportunity to meet other attendees!
- ❖ Each group has been assigned a group chaperone who knows the schedule and where you are supposed to be. We have a great day planned for you, so please follow your chaperone's lead.
- ❖ If at any time throughout the day you have any questions or problems, feel free to speak to your group chaperone.
- ❖ Lunch will be provided by the firm you are assigned to. The lunch will meet all the dietary restrictions and allergies indicated on your registration forms.
- ❖ This day has been designed for you to interact with a number of different women working in law. We encourage you to ask questions throughout the day. If you don't feel comfortable asking, your group chaperone can ask for you or you can send us questions in advance and we will forward them along.
- ❖ You're welcome to bring snacks, but please be mindful of allergies. This means absolutely no products containing peanuts.
- ❖ We encourage students to wear **business casual attire** - school uniforms, dress pants/slacks and a blouse, a skirt and nice top are all acceptable. Remember that you will be meeting women in law, so represent yourselves and your school well. WEAR SENSIBLE SHOES – no matter how cute those heels are, they were not made for walking downtown – opt for flats (or at least carry some in your purse).
