

# OJEN PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOPS 2018/19

Workshop	Description	Time Frame*
<b>Access to Justice Game</b>	Simulation of the challenges faced by individuals accessing the justice system to resolve a variety of common legal difficulties, from landlord tenant disputes to family law issues. Also introduces students to community resources for solving resolving legal problems.	<b>60-75 minutes</b>
<b>Intro to Charter Challenge</b>	Introduction to Ontario's only appellate-level high school moot program, with overview of various teaching methods.	<b>60-120 minutes</b>
<b>Mock Trial 101</b>	"Blitz" mock trial. Spend an hour preparing a simple case with the help of lawyers, then have a trial!	<b>120-150 minutes</b>
<b>Trial Advocacy</b>	Tips for helping students to structure arguments, formulate questions for mock trial examinations, and "thinking like a lawyer", with role-playing simulations to develop skills. Good follow-up to Mock Trial 101.	<b>75-120 minutes</b>
<b>Teaching Human Rights in Ontario</b>	Introduction to resource from the Ontario Human Rights Commission. A great way to look at domestic human rights law.	<b>45-75 minutes</b>
Workshop	Description	Time Frame*
<b>Intro to Steps to Justice</b>	Overview of Community Legal Education Ontario's website ( <a href="http://stepstojustice.ca">stepstojustice.ca</a> ) offering step-by-step information about legal problems. A tool for teachers and for students to get basic answers and work through how to deal with a legal problem. Workshop can focus on any of the following as worked examples: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Criminal Law</li> <li>• Debt and Consumer Rights</li> <li>• Family Law</li> <li>• Abuse and Domestic Violence</li> <li>• Health and Disability</li> <li>• Employment Law</li> <li>• Human Rights</li> </ul>	<b>45 minutes</b>
<b>Understanding International Law</b>	Overview of various resources for teaching international law. Can include information on International Criminal Court, UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, international humanitarian law and children in conflict, and an ICC mock trial about child soldiers.	<b>45-90 minutes</b>
<b>A Foot in the Door</b>	Introduction to OJEN's resource on real estate and housing law, with possibility for simulations such as a mock negotiation.	<b>45-90 minutes</b>
<b>Policing &amp; Society</b>	Introduction to OJEN's Policing & Society resource, which provides strategies to address with a wide range of ideas, opinions, and critiques about various approaches to policing.	<b>45 minutes</b>

\*Time frames are guidelines, and most sessions can be modified as needed to suit the time available.
